


# Moderna & Pfizer Infant/Toddler COVID-19 Vaccines Now Authorized Under Emergency Use and Recommended by CDC

- On June 17, 2022, FDA issued EUA for:
  - Moderna vaccine for 6 months to 17 years
  - Pfizer vaccine for 6 months to 4 years
- On June 18, 2022, the CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) and WSSSRW voted to recommend:
  - Moderna vaccine for 6 months to 5 years
  - Pfizer vaccine for 6 months to 4 years
- ACIP will discuss Moderna vaccine for 6-17 years at their upcoming meeting on June 22 and 23, 2022.




# Seasonal Influenza Activity Remains Elevated in California





- Influenza A (H3N2) viruses are predominant
- Influenza vaccine for 2021-2022 season will expire at the end of June 2022.

### Influenza Testing and Treatment

#### Testing

- Testing for influenza is recommended for all patients with respiratory illness in inpatient and congregate settings.
- Influenza testing is recommended in outpatient settings when it will inform clinical management or infection control.
- All persons tested for influenza should also be tested for SARS-CoV-2.

#### Treatment

- Provide influenza antiviral treatment as soon as possible to any patient with confirmed or suspected influenza who is hospitalized, at higher risk for influenza complications, or developing progressive illness.
- Treat both influenza and SARS-CoV-2 when co-infection is present.
- Suspected or laboratory-confirmed influenza outbreaks in long-term care facilities should be reported to the local health department.

### Updated Pneumococcal Vaccine Regimens


- New vaccine products: PCV15 and PCV20 licensed in 2021 for adults aged 18 years and older
- New regimen options recommended by ACIP:
  - PCV20 only
  - PCV15 + PPSV23

### How Do The Pneumococcal Vaccines Differ?



- PCV15 non-PCV13: includes serotypes 22F and 33F
- PCV20 non-PCV13: includes serotypes 22F, 33F, 8, 10A, 11A, 12F, and 15B
- PPSV23 non-PCV20: includes serotypes 2, 9N, 17F, and 20
