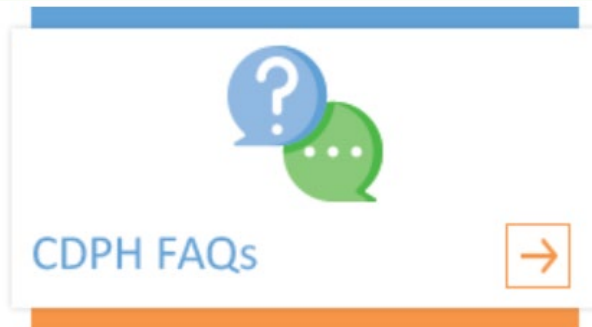

# AFL 23-09: COVID-19 Outbreak Investigation and Reporting Thresholds (1/18/23)

- Supersedes AFL 20-75.1 which was last updated 7/22/21
- Reminds all licensed health facilities of requirements to report outbreaks and unusual infectious disease occurrences.
- **Threshold for Additional Investigation by Facility**
  - ≥1 suspect, probable or confirmed COVID-19 case in a resident or HCP;
  - ≥3 cases of acute illness compatible with COVID-19 in residents with onset within a 72-hour period;
  - ≥1 suspect, probable or confirmed COVID-19 case in HCP
- **Threshold for Reporting to Local Public Health**
  - ≥1 probable or confirmed COVID-19 case in a resident or HCP;
  - ≥3 cases of acute illness compatible with COVID-19 in residents with onset within a 72-hour period;
  - ≥1 probable or confirmed COVID-19 case in HCP
- **Outbreak Definition**
  - ≥1 facility-acquired[5] COVID-19 case in a resident;
  - ≥3 suspect, probable or confirmed COVID-19 cases in HCP with epi-linkage and no other more likely sources of exposure for at least 2 of the cases

# AFL 23-10: Recommendations for Prevention and Control of Influenza in SNFs for the 2022–2023 Season during the COVID-19 Pandemic (1/18/23)

- Facilities should review the updated "[Recommendations for the Prevention and Control of Influenza in California SNFs during the COVID-19 Pandemic](#)" to ensure readiness for the influenza season.
- SNFs must optimize all effective influenza prevention and outbreak control interventions, including influenza vaccination of SNF residents and HCP, and prompt initiation of antiviral therapy and chemoprophylaxis when influenza is identified.
- For FY2023, reporting of SNF HCP influenza vaccination rates will be required and used to calculate payments via the [CMS SNF Quality Reporting Program \(QRP\)](#).

# AFL 23-12: COVID-19 Recommendations for PPE, Resident Placement/Movement, and Staffing (1/24/23)

- Supersedes AFL 20-74.1
- SNFs may move away from use of color-designated “zones”
- COVID-19 residents must be isolated in dedicated isolation area.
- Symptomatic residents and exposed residents should generally remain in their current room while undergoing testing [AFL 22-13.1](#).
  - Exposed residents should wear source control while outside their rooms but do not need to be quarantined or cared for by HCP using full PPE.
- Dedicated HCP with separate break rooms and restrooms are **no longer** required for residents with confirmed COVID-19 or residents with COVID-19 exposures.
  - However, HCP must understand the need to change gloves and gowns and perform hand hygiene between all residents, regardless of known COVID-19 or other infectious disease status.

# New Bivalent Booster Resource!

## Why should I get the COVID-19 booster if I might get COVID-19 anyway?

You are at high risk for developing *severe* COVID-19 if you:

- ✓ Are over the age of 50
- ✓ Have chronic health conditions
  - Diabetes
  - Overweight
  - High blood pressure
  - Lung conditions
- ✓ Live in a nursing home or assisted living facility



Adults 50 years and older who have received the COVID-19 bivalent booster vaccine are more than **43% less likely to experience symptoms**, even if they test positive.



Your chances of being **hospitalized** from COVID-19 is **decreased by 81%** if you receive the bivalent booster vaccine.



Your chances of **dying** from COVID-19 is **decreased by 86%** if you receive the bivalent booster vaccine.

# California Immunization Registry (CAIR2)

- CAIR2 is a secure, confidential, statewide computerized immunization information system for California residents.
- SNFs can register with CAIR2 to record vaccine doses administered and get access to immunization records.
