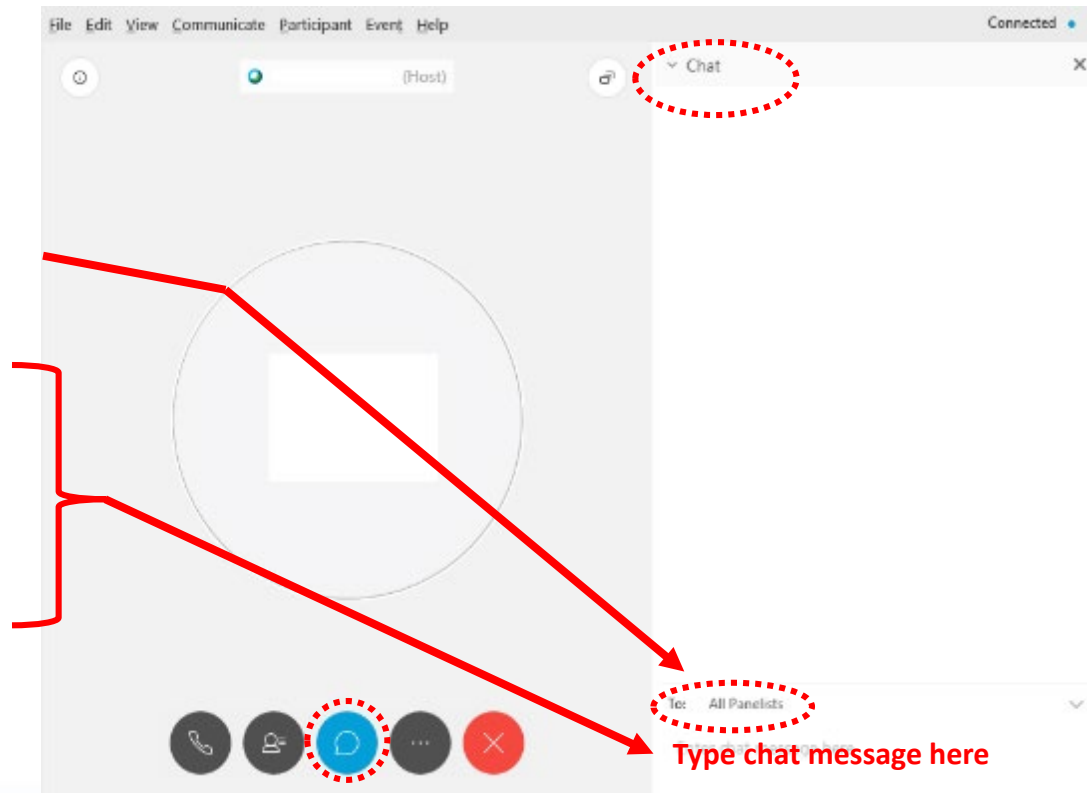

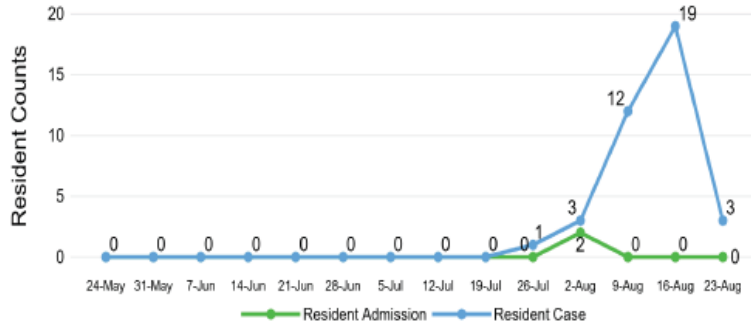

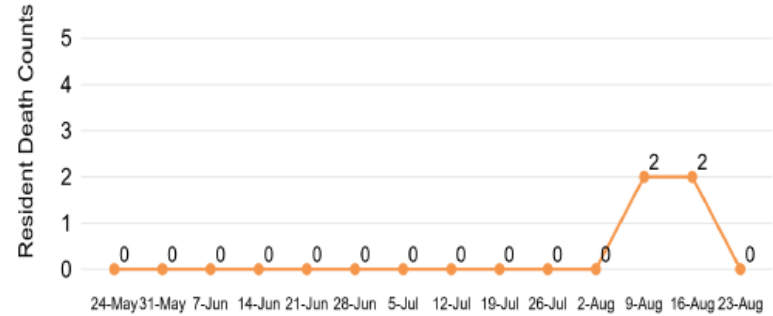

# Facility-Specific COVID-19 Run Chart

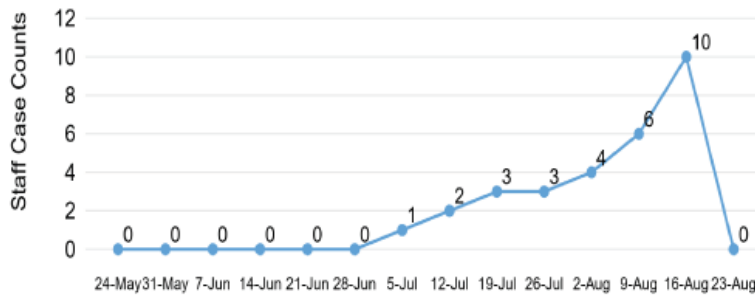
**Resident: COVID-19 New Laboratory Positive Case Counts**



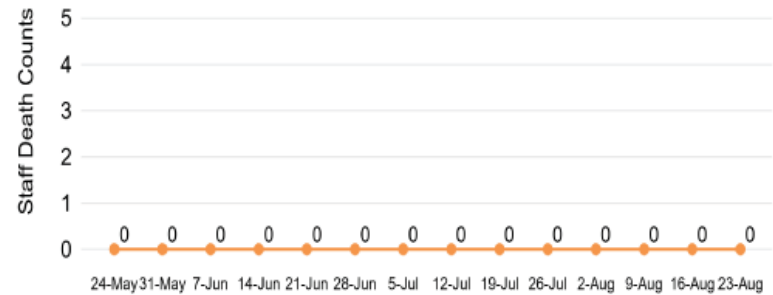
**Resident: COVID-19 Death Counts**

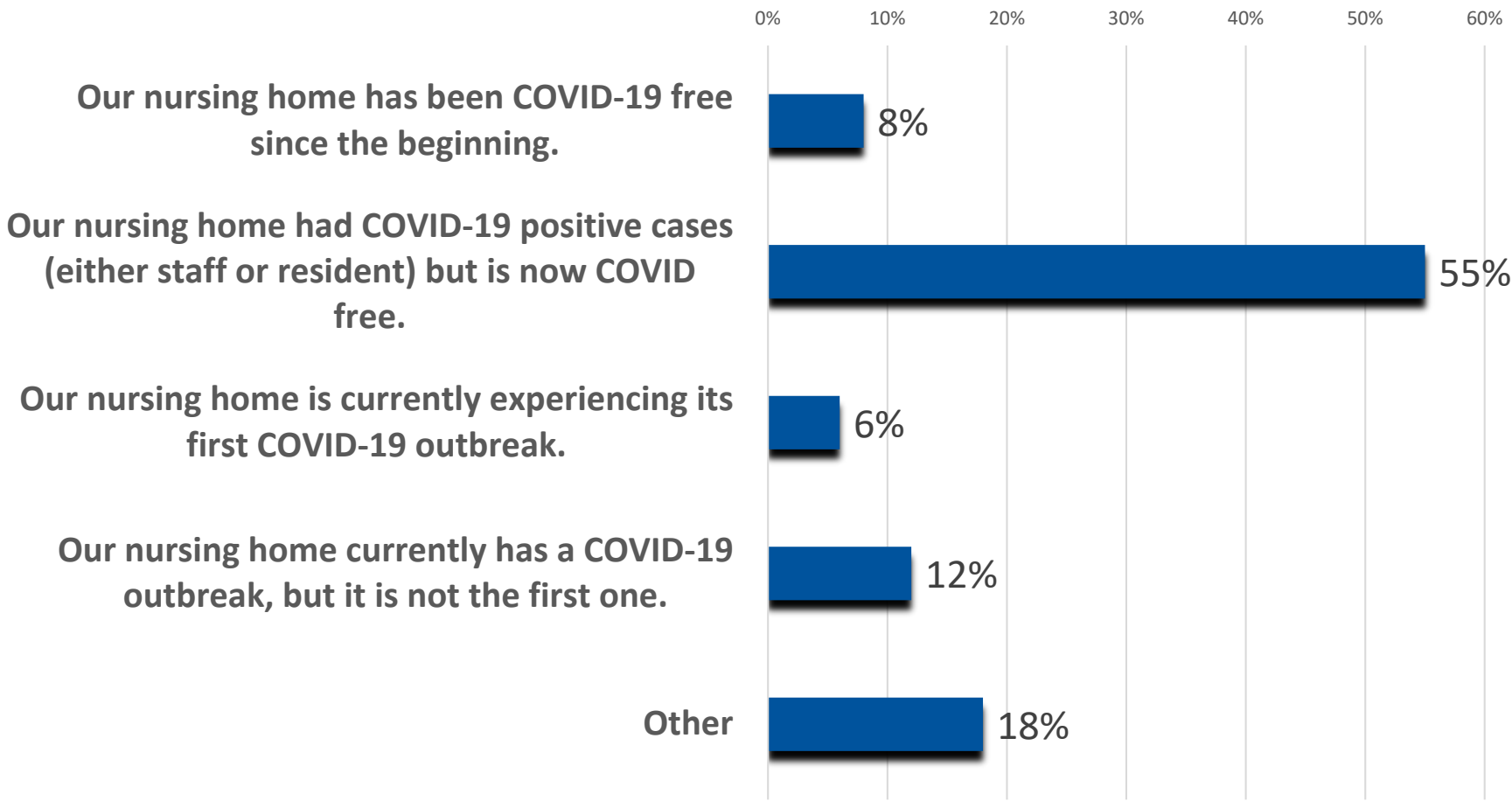
