### What is CAIR?

- A secure, internet-based immunization registry for California
- Tracks patient immunization and TB test information
- Used by thousands of health care providers and other agencies in California
- Governed by California Health and Safety Code 120440



# AB 1797 Requires Facilities to Submit Immunization Data to a CA Registry

- Effective Jan 1, 2023
- Requires facilities who administer vaccines or/and offer TB tests to enter:
  - Immunization information,
  - TB test results, and
  - Race and ethnicity information for each patient

into the California Immunization Registry (CAIR) OR Healthy Futures/RIDE.





# **CAIR Benefits**

- ✓ Save time
- ✓ Improve patient care

- ✓ Quickly run vaccine reports to access data required for reporting (e.g., influenza and pneumococcal vaccination coverage of residents)

# Run Vaccine Reports

- CAIR allows you to <u>run a doses administered report</u>.
- HEDIS Patient-Match Data Request: Health plans, independent practice associations, and medical groups can submit member lists to CAIR and receive back matched patient immunization histories.
  - This may help to meet NHSN and other CMS reporting requirements in addition to HEDIS.

# What is CAIR Quick Entry?

### CAIR Quick Entry

- allows facilities to report vaccine administration data to CAIR through My Turn
- can be used to report data for all vaccines accepted by CAIR, including flu and COVID-19 vaccine
- does not enable facilities to look up patient vaccination histories or run reports (CAIR must be accessed directly for these capabilities)

### Is CAIR Quick Entry Appropriate for Your Facility?

- CAIR Data Exchange or Manual Entry is preferable to CAIR Quick Entry for most providers.
  - Smaller facilities that administer a few different vaccines may find it beneficial to use CAIR Quick Entry instead of CAIR Manual Entry.
- A CAIR or Healthy Futures ID AND a My Turn account is required to use CAIR Quick Entry. However, facilities are not required to manage vaccine appointments in My Turn.

### Already Submitting Doses to CAIR?

### **Ensure Doses are Accurately Entered**

- Run reports on administered doses to ensure data is being entered accurately. You may compare this report against doses in a vaccine administration log or an EHR report.
- If your facility sends data from your EHR to CAIR automatically (Data Exchange), CDPH strongly encourages you to set up at least one staff with a Data Exchange Quality Assurance (DX QA) user role in CAIR.
  - This role has access to the "Check Status" page for monitoring data submissions and quality.

# How can I help ensure CAIR records are more complete?


CDPH encourages facilities to submit all historical immunization records to improve completeness of records:

 To submit historical immunization records through data exchange, please work with your EHR vendor support and a CAIR Data Exchange Specialist (<u>CAIRDataExchange@cdph.ca.gov</u>) to discuss options.

# Digital Vaccine Record (DVR)

California residents can now retrieve both their COVID-19 immunization records and California immunization records.



- Includes all routine immunizations
- Shows immunizations that may be overdue
- Available in <u>English</u>, <u>Spanish</u>, <u>Arabic</u>, Chinese (<u>simplified</u> and <u>traditional</u>), <u>Korean</u>, <u>Tagalog</u>, and <u>Vietnamese</u>
- Can be used as documentation for work or school
- Has a mobile-friendly interface

Eligible hospitals and critical access hospitals providers can qualify for the Medicare Promoting Interoperability



#### Comply with state law and meet program requirements

All California providers are required (AB 1797) to enter all immunizations administered into a California immunization registry (CAIR or Healthy Futures/RIDE).

#### **Immunization Registry Notice to Patients and Parents**

Immunizations or 'shots' prevent serious diseases. Tuberculasis (TB) screening tests help to determine if you may have TB infection and can be required for school or work. Keeping track of shots/TB tests you have received can be hard. It's especially hard if more than one healthcare provider gave them. Today, healthcare providers use a secure computer system called an immunization registry to keep track of shots and TB tests. If you change providers, your new provider can use the registry to see the shot/TB test record.

#### How Does the Registry Help You?

Remind you about shots needed

- . Keeps trock of all shots and TB tests (skin tests/chest x-rays), so you don't miss any or get too many
- . Sends reminders when you or your child need shots
- Gives you access to your digital vaccine record at myvaccinerecord.cdph.ca.gov. Records can be used for childrage, school, or work

#### How Does the Registry Help Your Health Care Team?

Doctors, nurses, health plans, and public health agencies use the registry to:

- . See which shots/TB tests are needed
  - Prevent disease in your community
    - Help with record-keeping

#### Can Schools or Other Programs See the Registry?

Yes, but this is limited. Schools, child cares, and other agencies allowed under California law may

- . See which shots/TB tests children in their programs need
- Make sure children have all shots/TB tests needed to start child care or school

#### What Information Can Be Shared in a Registry?

- Patient's name, sex, race/ethnicity, and birth date
- Limited information to identify patients
- Details about a patient's shors/1B tests

What's entered in the registry is treated like other private medical information. Misuse of the registry can be punished by law. Under California law, only healthcare provider offices, health plans, or public health departments may see your address and phone number. Health Officials can also look at the registry to protect

#### Patient and Parent Rights

· Parents' or guardians' names

It's your legal right to ask your healthcare provider:

- . To prevent non-clinical CAIR sites from accessing your (or your child's) registry records
- Not to get shot appointment reminders from your provider's affice.
- To look at a copy of your or your child's shot/TB test records
- Who has seen the records and to correct any mistakes



If you DO NOT want your provider's office to share your immunization/TB test information with non-clinical CARR slaz, ask your provider to lock your records in CARR. Too may also complete a "Request to Lock Ky CARR Record form from the CARR website (bit-ly/CARRorms). If you change your mind, complete a "Request to Unidos my CARR Record" form.
