



CDC FPP Resident and Staff Vaccine Rates (cont.)

 Median of 77.8% of residents and 37.5% of staff members received ≥1 vaccine dose through the program.





Factors Affecting Vaccine Confidence

- Vaccine confidence is the trust that people have in:
 - Recommended vaccines
 - Providers who administer vaccines
 - Processes and policies that lead to vaccine development
- Barriers include:
 - Concerns about vaccine safety, side effects, administration
 - Skepticism regarding clinical trials and vaccine approval processes
 - Desire to delay receipt of vaccine to see how coworkers do
 - Concern about pregnancy and fertility issues
 - Misinformation on social media or from other sources

This toolkit provides long-term care facility (LTCF) administrators and clinical leadership with information and resources to help build vaccine confidence among healthcare personnel (HCP) and residents. You play a critical role in providing trusted information and ensuring high COVID-19 vaccination coverage in your facility.

Based on <u>recommendations</u> from the <u>Advisory Committee on</u> <u>Immunization Practices (ACIP)</u>, an independent panel of medical and public health experts, <u>CDC recommends that HCP and LTCF residents</u> <u>be among those offered the first doses of COVID-19 vaccines</u>. 
