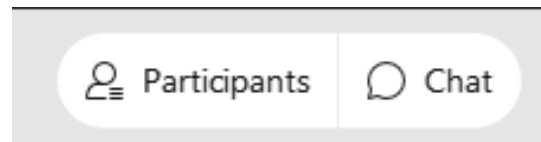

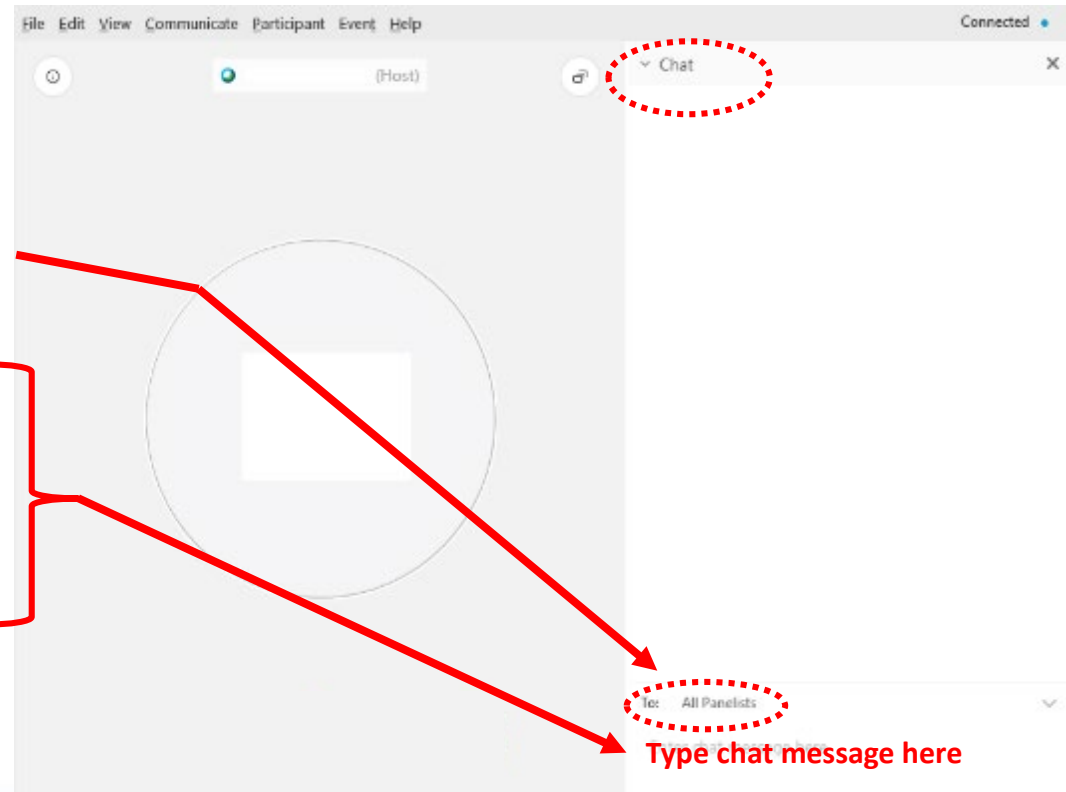


How to Submit a Question

1. To submit a question, click on the **Chat Button** located in the bottom right corner of your WebEx window.



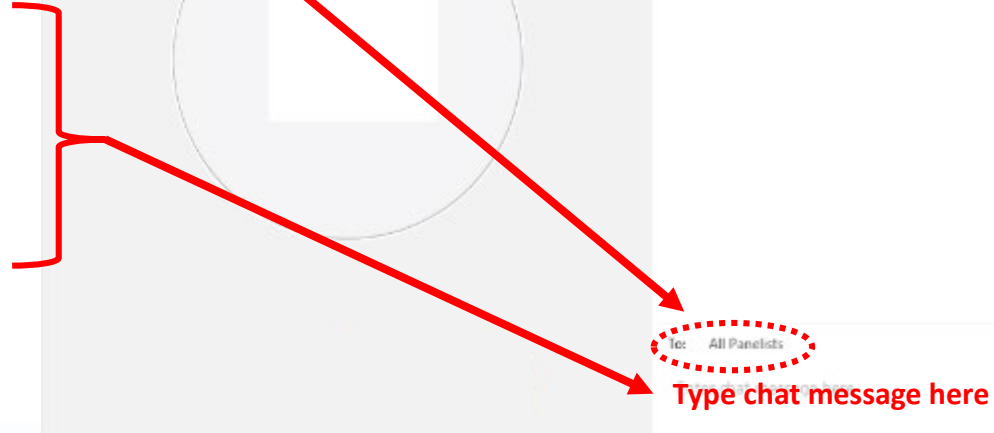
2. The **Chat** panel will open on your right.

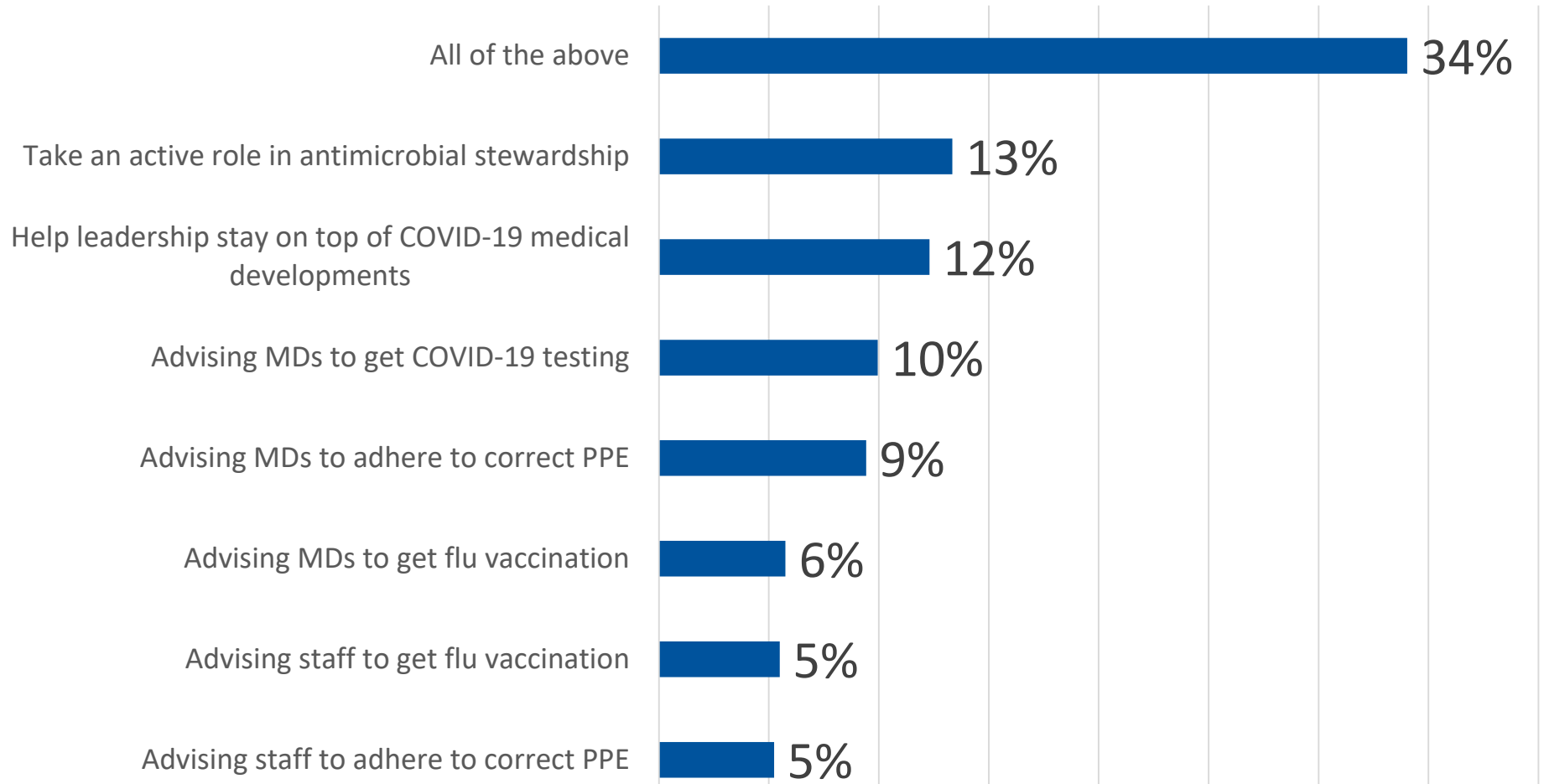
