What is a Peer Mentee?

A peer mentee is someone who is new to an experience or situation and looking to make a connection with a peer who is thriving with kidney disease.



What is a Peer Mentor?

A peer mentor is someone with at least one year of experience with kidney disease who shares their experiences to help the peer mentee feel less alone in their journey.



Benefits of Peer Support

Peer support works because patients offer each other something the clinician does not have shared life experience.

How Does This Work?

Contact the Network's Peer Mentor Champion. You'll speak with a social worker who will ask a few questions to best match you for the program. Once enrolled, the Peer Champion will arrange the initial call between the mentor and mentee.
